

I want to personally thank the Committee members and all the workers whose names were listed in last week's Pulse. "But the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps." The foolish versus the wise. Today's parable sets these two groups in

stark contrast to one another. Two crowds of young women wait for a wedding feast. One group comes prepared for the unexpected, the other just assumes everything will go according to schedule. But it doesn't! The Bridegroom is late, and the foolish virgins are left out in the dark-literally--while the wise ones enjoy the feast inside.



The lesson here is not

just about having foresight and gathering the corresponding equipment. It's about being ready for the second coming of Christ. Jesus himself is the "Bridegroom." Traditionally we refer to the Church as the "Bride of Christ" and we, as the people of God who constitute the Church, are even now awaiting the real feast, the culmination of time when Jesus returns. But are we standing among the wise or the foolish as we wait?

Jesus tells us today, "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Are we spiritually awake? Do we have extra oil to see us through, or are we hitting the bottom of the barrel and running on spiritual fumes so to speak? Do we think it's enough to do the bare minimum as we wait for Christ--stepping into church without really being present, or calling ourselves Christian without really taking up the challenge of the cross? In order to avoid standing outside the feast with the foolish, we will want to make sure we fill our flasks with oil or, in other words, fill our hearts with the love of God, fill our minds with his word and his teachings, and fill our souls with the virtues that unite us to his will. If we stock up on these important supplies, we can count ourselves among the wise!

This collection in November replaces the Campaign for Human Development. The beauty of this collection is that it is local. The funds go directly to Catholic Charities which supports

- Adopt-a-Family for Christmas (of which St. Matthew benefits)
- Adoption and foster care services
- Adult day health care and senior care
- All Saints Soup Kitchen and food pantry
- Health counseling
- And many more services

The problem is in the last few years, donations have been decreasing, and the amount of services and outreach CCSEM can cover may be reduced as a result. In short, Catholic Charities is asking for your help, and, indeed, all parishes will respond. Whatever we can do will be a good thing.

I also want to remind everyone that our Memorial Mass for the Dead will be on Saturday, November 25, at the 4:30 p.m. Mass. If you have never attended, I encourage you to do so. Complete with a candlelight entrance procession, we honor those whom we have buried this past year from the parish.

The date for this Mass is later than in years' past due to the beatification of Solanus Casey. That event will be at Ford Field with Mass at 4:00 p.m. Remember our own 4:30 p.m. Mass will be cancelled that day to accommodate the beatification. I will be concelebrating the Mass, and 75 parishioners will be attending.

Since the entire month of November is dedicated to the dead, remember to place the names of loved ones, relatives, friends, neighbors, in our Book of Remembrance. We will pray for them each week.

May God be with you this week and may we continue to call others to FAITH.

Prayer to Sell a House (or School Buildings!)

O, Saint Joseph, you who taught our Lord the carpenter's trade, and saw to it that he was always properly housed, hear our earnest plea. We want you to help us now as you helped your foster-child Jesus, and as you have helped many others in the matter of selling property.

We wish to sell our school buildings quickly, easily, and profitably; and we implore you to grant our wish by bringing St. Matthew Parish a good buyer, one who is eager, compliant, and honest, and by letting nothing impede the rapid conclusion of the sale.

Dear Saint Joseph, we know you would do this for us out of the goodness of your heart and in your own good time, but our need is very great now, and so we must make you hurry on our behalf.

Saint Joseph, we am going to place you in a difficult position with your head in darkness, and you will suffer as our Lord suffered, until our school buildings are sold.

Then, Saint Joseph, we swear before the cross and God Almighty, that we will redeem you, and you will receive our gratitude and a place of honor in our parish.

Directives for Solanus Casey Beatification Mass Saturday, November 18 at 4 p.m.

There will be 75 parishioners attending the beatification. Seventy (70) have signed up for bus transportation, and five (5) will be driving on their own. We have secured two buses. One from Global Bus Systems which seats 56 passengers, and Mr. Joe Zainea's shuttle bus from the Majestic Café which seats 20. Between the two buses, we will have adequate seating for all who signed up for bus transportation. A few important particulars are listed below for a smooth day to and from the event.

Private Vehicle Parking

- Attendees arriving in private vehicles may choose from a variety of city— and privately—owned surface lots, garages, or metered street parking. It is estimated that costs for parking will range from \$10-\$50. Street/ metered parking is enforced by the Detroit Municipal Parking Department. The rates and hours vary, so attendees are encouraged to follow all posted signs and notices. Go to http://www.parkdetroit.us for more information
- Those attending by car must pick up their tickets at the rectory by Friday, November 17, no later than 5:00 pm. Your ticket is required to enter the stadium.

Bus Transportation from St. Matthew's Parking Lot

- All attendees riding the buses must arrive at the church parking lot no later than 1:00 pm.
- Begin parking closest to the Activities Building, as we will need room for the buses to maneuver near the island
- Bus riders will receive their tickets prior to boarding the bus. Tickets will be identified by family name and are assigned on a first-come basis.
- The bus will leave promptly at 1:30 pm in order to arrive at Ford Field by 2:00 pm.
- All buses from the parishes will be assigned an official parking location. No drop-off or pick-up will be near the stadium for security reasons.
- From remote bus parking locations, attendees can choose to walk to the stadium (it should not be far) or choose to take a shuttle which will be provided from the parking lot to the stadium should the lot be a distance away.
- Please note the company and number of the bus and the lot you are in so that you can locate it after the Mass. Remember it will be dark by then.
- Concessions will be open in the stadium til 3:00 pm for your convenience and will close by 3:15 pm so you can ready yourself for Mass. We must remember why we are here. No eating/drinking should occur during the beatification liturgy.
- Choirs and musical groups will be performing prior to the beginning of Mass to help you ready yourself for the sacred liturgy.
- Communion distribution will be directed by AoD ushers and will be distributed by priests and deacons. Please follow directions at the appropriate time.
- At the end of the liturgy, please proceed to the buses as quickly as you can so that we can return to the parish leaving no one behind. There will be no time to go to restaurants or to stop for food after the Mass. On the return trip, board the same bus you boarded from St. Matthew's parking lot.

- Dress comfortably and appropriately for Mass. We will be representing St. Matthew Parish.
- Note: Our tickets are in Section 120, Rows 37 to 39.
 You may enter any gate. However, Gate F and Gate G are near our section. Both are off St. Antoine and Gate F is indicated as Not Handicap Accessible.

There will be much walking and stair climbing that day, and it will be a long day—but one truly filled with faith and grace. We ask everyone to pack their patience and remember why we are there.


