



2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

When you think of being Catholic, what do you think of? Perhaps you grew up with your only associations being fasting, nuns with rulers, and "Catholic guilt." Our faith can sometimes have the connotation of restriction and absence, not abundance. Who is God in your life? Is He the divine law-giver, the judge punishing the rule-breakers? These are certainly attributes of God. But the laws don't exist for themselves

alone. They exist to help us love one another as God loves us. And this loving God is the author of abundance and joy.

Did you hear today's Gospel? "There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee." Here at this wedding, Jesus would perform "the beginning of his signs...and so reveal his glory." This first sign isn't a miraculous healing. He didn't raise someone from the dead. He kept a party going! "There were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons...the water...had become wine." The wine has run out. Jesus creates somewhere between 120 and 180 gallons to help his friend save face. We may not have such momentous miracles in our lives, but God is watching out for us. The string of green lights when you're running late. The sale on the replacement appliance you need. The friend who calls at just the right time. These are the little moments of God's abundance. We just need to

Not only does Jesus surprise, but the guests point out to their host: "You have kept the good wine until now." The divine wine is better than the earthly variety. God's goodness is better than what we can grasp at for ourselves. Isn't that how it always goes?

TIME: The Beginning and the End

"I am Alpha and Omega, said the Lord God, who is, who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." (Rev 1:4)

We think of time as a progression of successive moments, whether they be minutes, days, years, or even millennia. This is our experience of time, whether seemingly short or long. But time as it really is has a dimension beyond just our temporal time, as it also has Eternal dimensions. Christ has always been in this Eternal time, or as it is spoken of the in the Gospel as the "Age to Come," distinct from just the "Present Age" which we experience in the here and now.

Yet Christ came on earth and entered through His personal experience into our experience of time, personal limited time which had a beginning and will have an end. He was born here, lived here, died here, and rose from the dead here. This is why we can experience His love so directly and personally all the time since He was born.

Since Christ is born, and we glorify Him, God is not just our Father or our Savior, but is also our brother, our dearest friend, and, therefore, is eminently approachable and personal to us. He is close and real and alive and sympathetic to our joys and sorrows. He is near, nearer than anyone else can be, for He is the forerunner and bridge to our life to come: Eternal time, simultaneous time, everlasting time without beginning or end. And He is not only at the beginning and at the end, but He Himself is the beginning and end of all things, and is the Light of the "Age to Come." May we always stand close and reflect this brightest light, and be illumined inside with Him until we shine with Him shining out.
