



2nd Sunday of Lent

As we march through Lent, it can be easy to think it's all about sacrifice. No chocolate, no alcohol, no meat on Fridays. Yet here, only in the second week of Lent, we have the story of the transfiguration. This reading reminds us of the "why" behind what we do. We don't fast from dessert to lose weight. We don't donate money or serve others because it's merely a nice thing to do. Lent is about transformation!

Peter, James, and John trudged up the mountainside behind Jesus. This must have been a difficult hike, because when they reached the top, "Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep." Despite our best efforts, perhaps we, too, can be asleep to the deeper meaning of the Lenten season. Jesus is transfigured while they slumber, but eventually they become "fully awake, [and] they saw his glory and the two men standing with him."

This is no small thing! The disciples witness Jesus in his divine splendor and see the miraculous apparitions of Moses and Elijah. The entire mountain becomes a spiritual breakthrough. "A cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud." These symbols are present in the Old Testament. They are present on Mount Sinai when Moses prayed alone and received the 10 Commandments. Elijah had a similar experience when he prayed alone before God. But here are ordinary men, former fishermen, who have been drawn up into an adventure beyond their wildest expectations. Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the fulfillment of all that came before. But Christianity is not the religion of the elite, where only the select few are allowed to participate. We are all invited into spiritual transformation. Lent is a privileged time for this!



A Family Perspective

Jesus "went up the mountain to pray," and he was "changed." Prayer has the power to change us. This Lent set aside a few minutes each day to pray for members of your family. Pray before each meal; and if you are married, spend five minutes in prayer together.

FASTING

Fasting was not adopted in the church as a result of any ecclesiastical commandment but began as a voluntary practice. It was regarded as a matter of course that a Christian should fast for various motives - to reinforce prayer, to do penance for sins, to save something for the poor, or even to prepare for a feast. Therefore, one fasted to prepare for Easter!

Merciful God,

You called us forth from the dust of the earth;
You claimed us for Christ in the waters of baptism.
Look upon us as we enter these Forty Days
bearing the mark of ashes,
And bless our journey through the desert of Lent

Journey to Uganda

In Uganda, we encounter Annet and her family, children forced to flee violence, searching for stability. How are we called to welcome the stranger in our midst? How can you support those worldwide who are forced to flee their homes to find safety or better opportunities?

Encounter Annet - Annet's youngest sister calls her Mom—and for good reason. Since their parents' deaths 4 years ago, 16-yearold Annet has been caring for her three siblings: Gladys, 6, Irene, 8 and Emmanuel, 10. It hasn't been easy. Ongoing violence in their home country, South Sudan, forced Annet to take her siblings and flee south to neighboring Uganda. It was a dangerous journey, but Annet kept them safe despite threats from rebel soldiers.

For more than 2 years now, Annet and her siblings have been living in Bidi Bidi, one of the world's largest refugee settlements. Formed in 2015, Bidi Bidi is home to nearly 300,000 people—many South Sudanese who, like Annet, fled for their lives to Uganda. While Annet is happy to be away from the violence, life in Bidi Bidi is hard—especially for a young woman trying to raise her siblings. That's why CRS is building houses for families like Annet's. A place to call home means Annet can rest a little easier at night knowing her family is safe.

But that's not all. CRS is also helping people like Annet learn to farm and giving them the tools they need to succeed. Annet has her own plot of land to plant on so she will be able to continue providing for her siblings. For her, that's the most important thing. While she wants her family to return to South Sudan one day, for now she knows that Bidi Bidi is the safer option. Meanwhile, she encourages her siblings to go to school and does all she can to ensure they'll have a bright future.

"My hope is to raise my siblings," she says. "And I know I can do it with the help of CRS and my Catholic faith."

Permanent Diaconate - Men discerning a call to the permanent diaconate ministry are invited to attend an information night, with their wives, if married, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, March 20, at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit.

The evening will explore the three-fold ministry of deacons: the ministry of the Word, ministry of the liturgy, and ministry of charity and justice. Attendees will also learn about the application process and requirements for entering formation for the permanent diaconate.


