

"Ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance ..." In the ancient world and into the Middle Ages, there was no treatment for leprosy. People thought it was wildly contagious and were suspicious of any skin diseases. Lepers were isolated from civil society. This isolation was uphold by the Mosaic Law. Should there be a healing from leprosy, the former leper was to present himself to a priest to certify the healing. Like Jesus commands, "Show yourselves to the priests." The person would then undergo a religious rite to be formally reintroduced to society. In other words, a leper got their life back. So why didn't they come back?

"As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him." Of the ten lepers healed by Christ, only one returns with a grateful heart. The others, perhaps, were thankful enough. Perhaps they couldn't believe their luck, and they hastened to the priests to confirm the healing. They were more than willing to leave their life of rejection and isolation behind. Why take any steps backward, when the way ahead was so attractive? An attitude like this is perhaps understandable, but few would admire it.

How about you? Do you come back? If you've ever had the experience of getting what you hoped and prayed for, you know that this can sometimes be easier said than done. When we've wanted something badly enough, how easy it can be to focus on the gift rather than the giver. The truth is, God is daily offering us gifts: the gift of our existence, of the created world, of family and friends, of modern conveniences. Even in times of distress, there is always something to be thankful for. This Sunday, give yourself a gratitude check. Count your blessings. Glorify God and thank Him for the gift of your life!

A Family Perspective

Everyone needs "A Round Tuit." The lepers in today's Gospel probably meant to thank Jesus. Excited about being cured, they didn't get 'around-to-it.' We get caught up in our own interests and fail to appreciate what we have or to say what is in our hearts. This week get yourself "A Round Tuit."



St. Luke the Evangelist, Feast Day, October 18th

The Gospel according to Luke is the third of the four New Testament Gospels and, with the Gospels according to Mark and Matthew, one of the three Synoptic Gospels (i.e., those presenting a common view).

It is traditionally credited to St. Luke, "the beloved physician, a close associate of the St. Paul the Apostle. Luke's Gospel is clearly written for Gentile converts: it traces Christ's genealogy, for example, back to Adam, the "father" of the human race rather than to Abraham, the father of the Jewish people. The date and place of the writing of the Gospel are uncertain, but many date the Gospel to 63–70 AD, others somewhat later.

Like St. Matthew, Luke derives much of his Gospel from that of St. Mark, generally following Mark's sequence and incorporating about 50 percent of Mark's material into his work. The Gospels of Luke and Matthew, however, share a good deal of material not found in the Gospel according to Mark, suggesting that the two evangelists may have had access to another common source.

Despite its similarities to the other Synoptic Gospels, however, Luke's narrative contains much that is unique. It gives details of Jesus' infancy found in no other Gospel: the census of Caesar Augustus, the journey to Bethlehem, Jesus' birth, the adoration of the shepherds, Jesus' circumcision, the words of Simeon, and Jesus at age 12 in the temple talking with the doctors of the law. It also is the only Gospel to give an account of the Ascension. Among the notable parables found only in Luke's Gospel are those of the good Samaritan and the prodigal son.

Luke's Gospel is also unique in its perspective. It resembles the other synoptics in its treatment of the life of Jesus, but it goes beyond them in narrating the ministry of Jesus, widening its perspective to consider God's overall historical purpose and the place of the church within it. Luke, and its companion book, Acts of the Apostles, portray the church as God's instrument of redemption on Earth in the interim between the death of Christ and the Second Coming. The two books combined provide the first Christian history, outlining God's purpose through three historical epochs: the epoch of the Law and the prophets, which lasted from ancient Israel to the time of St. John the Baptist; the epoch of Jesus' ministry; and the epoch of the church's mission, from the Ascension to the return of Christ.



People ask at times, "Where does the money collected on World Mission Sunday go?" This collection, the responsibility of the local office of the society for the Propagation of the Faith, is taken in every parish throughout the world on this day designated by our Holy Father.

Notices are sent to the local Bishop in each of the 1,200 missionary dioceses throughout the world of the results of this collection and the amount of grants available to him. Then the bishop requests information from his local parishes in these dioceses as to what their needs are. When he receives word what these parish

communities need such as a new church, school, clinic or orphanage, he requests funds for these projects to the Propagation of the Faith in Rome for approval. A determined amount is also sent to the 1,200 bishops for the administration of their diocese and for the training of their seminarians and future religious.

About \$12 million dollars come from the people of the United States. Five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) of these funds are collected in the Archdiocese of Detroit. We have the most successful collection in the country, thanks to the missionary minded people who live and work here.
