

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

On the cusp of fame, power, or influence, would you turn it down? Today's Gospel again features John the Baptist. Controversial but popular, John has gathered quite a group of followers. He has disciples. People come from near and far to be baptized by him. Pharisees and government leaders are drawn to his preaching. If John was another man, a lesser man, he would have claimed his own greatness. Instead, John the Baptist is a witness to humility.

"The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and said, 'Behold the Lamb of God ... he is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me."... the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known.'" Rather than point to himself, John points to Christ. John could have grasped at what he had accumulated. He could have seen Jesus as a Messianic competitor. Instead, John knows who he is. He knows his place as forerunner. Because John knows who Jesus is. "I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

A life of humility, a life for others, can be challenging to live. So much of our culture is built around achievement and individualism. We can justify it, too, in pursuit of "greater goods" and higher ideals. In the process, however, we might miss our own participation in the kingdom of God. John, for all of his humility, was not an afterthought. In another Gospel passage, Jesus calls him "the greatest prophet," even the greatest of men. Why? Because he fulfills the mission given to him by God: to announce the coming of the Messiah. We too are prophets and forerunners. Our witness to the Gospel is meant to point people to Jesus. Consider your own mission this week. To whom are you called to announce the good news of the Son of God?



SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Next week, on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God. Last year, Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God, "so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people" (Misericordi et Misera, 7). The scriptures are treasures filled with countless riches! From Genesis to Revelation, God speaks to us in human language. By speaking to us, God reveals his part in this great love story: God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him." (1John 4:36).

In the Archdiocese of Detroit, we hear a lot about the power of the Word of God. We speak of the Gospel as something to be unleashed. We recognize that the Word of God has the potential to change hearts. When we proclaim the Word to others, they encounter the <u>power</u> of the Word and the <u>person</u> of the Word: Jesus Christ. But have you personally spent enough time hearing what Jesus is saying to you through the Word?

Pope Francis is asking everyone in the Church, every diocese, parish, family, and parishioner, to read and listen to the Word of God anew. In preparation for the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God, consider your favorite Scripture passage. How has God used it to speak to you, change your heart, lead you, or bring you peace? Ask yourself how can I be open in these coming days to receive the gift of loving the Word of God more? How can I make my own these words from today's psalm, "In the written scroll it is prescribed for me, to do your will, O my God, is my delight, and your law is within my heart" (Psalm 40:8-0)?

In response to the Holy Father's request to focus on the Word of God on the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, I would like to invite the entire parish to a Reflection and Holy Hour on the Sacred Scripture, on Sunday afternoon, January 26, 2020, at 3:00 p.m. in the

church. I will examine the question on how to read the Bible and look at its basic structure. Immediately after the presentation, we will have a time of quiet prayer, reflection, and adoration before the blessed Sacrament followed by Benediction.

I would ask that you would place this on your calendars. Bring family members, children, and neighbors. We oftentimes gather for social and fundraising events as a parish, let us also gather for this spiritual time. What a great way to relax, be informed, and pray on a Sunday afternoon, the Lord's Day.

So before you have your Sunday drive or go out to dinner, come and join us for a Word of God Sunday.

I cannot thank you as I would for all you've done for me;
I cannot find the words I should to tell you fittingly
your kindliness has meant so much
that only One I know can e'er repay a service such
as this one from here today.
Therefore, to Him I delegate what I cannot express.
May God repay you - early or late,
for all your kindliness. Amen.

Priestly Vocations - This January 30 through February 2, men discerning a call to the priesthood have the chance to experience the seminary firsthand at a discernment weekend at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit.

Men who are high school seniors to age 55 will spend four days living at the seminary, focusing on the aspects of seminary life and the four pillars of formation (spiritual, human, intellectual, and pastoral fellowship), which are the foundation of the seminary formation program. They will also spend time in fellowship and prayer.

Thanks to gifts to the Catholic Services Appeal, the archdiocesan Office of Priestly Vocations offers these up close and stress-free looks at seminary life several times a year. The next discernment weekend will be held March 19 to 22. A discernment overnight, for high school freshmen through juniors, will be held April 17 to 18.


